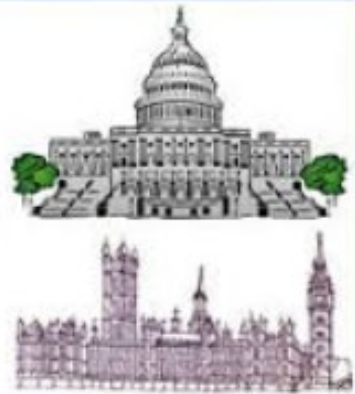

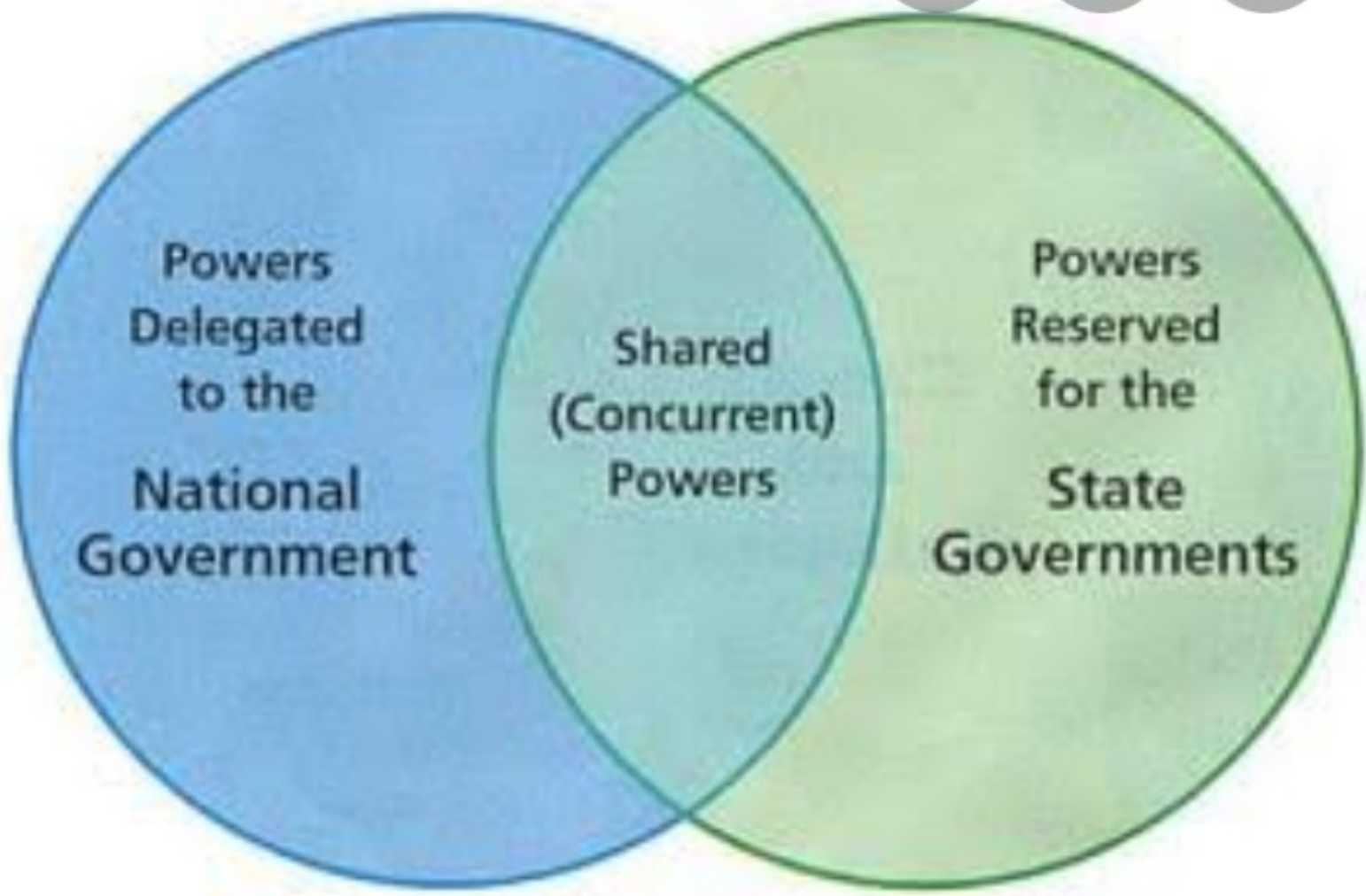


Judiciary

The system of courts that interprets and applies the law in the name of the state.



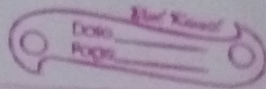
Federalism
